Chain of Custody for DIY Stores

Homebase has become the first DIY retailer to achieve FSC Chain of Custody certification in the UK. Certified by Soil Association, Homebase's FSC certificate number, SA-COC-8888, will appear on 'own brand' products such as the timber range and MDF, chip and fibre boards, garden fencing, sheds and outdoor timber products, internal and external doors, Homebase bark chips and ornamental mulches.



"In today's world of global trade, it's hard enough to determine where the timber comes from," explained Homebase Sustainable Business Manager, Charles Drewe (left), "let alone know that the forest operates in a professional way, looking after its

social and environmental responsibilities and ensuring that the timber harvested is sustainable and well managed for our future generations. Having this Chain of Custody means that not only do independent specialists verify that the forest is being well managed and all the social and environmental factors are being considered, but that the timber you have requested is in fact the timber that ends up in your products."

Next in line is B&Q, the largest DIY chain in the U.K. B&Q has signed a deal with the certification body SmartWood, a program of the Rainforest Alliance, and is aiming to certify a number of key stores in the first half of 2005.

B&Q is targeting business customers such as Government and local authority purchasing departments as well as general trade customers who are increasingly demanding timber and manufactured wooden products from well managed forests.

Mike Cartwright, B&Q's Business to Business Manager said, "The key benefit to our business customers is to have the evidence to promote FSC certified products they buy from B&Q as traceable from the store right back to the forest."


FSC Paper for Children in Need calender

WWF Research shows benefits of FSC Certification.

A new study launched today by WWF shows that credible certification brings added value to society, the environment and the economy. A systematic analysis of all changes forest managers have had to make to obtain FSC certification of 18 Million hectares of forests in Estonia, Germany, Latvia, Russia, Sweden and the UK, shows that certification led to significant improvements to biodiversity conservation, management planning, health & safety and the employment rights of forest workers.

The study analysed 2817 Corrective Action Requests which were raised by independent certifiers as forest managers sought to achieve and maintain FSC certification in Estonia, Germany, Latvia, Russia, Sweden and the UK. These Corrective Action Requests detailed shortcomings on environmental, social and economic issues and were the basis for WWF's systematic analysis of the nature of the improvements achieved on the ground through FSC.

"Our analysis provides conclusive evidence of the value of credible certification for a wide range of stakeholders across Europe", said Duncan Pollard, Head of the WWF European Forest Programme. "We simply looked at what actual changes FSC certification has brought in forest management, and the results speak for themselves. The study also brings out clearly the social and economic benefits which FSC brings for policy makers, governments, forest owners, forest industry, those employed in the forest industry and recreational forest users."

In Estonia, Germany, Latvia, Russia, Sweden and the UK biodiversity values were improved through measures such as: lower impact silviculture; improved protection of key habitats; increased deadwood levels; measures favouring species diversity; reduced soil compaction; improved water management and improved pollution control.

In all 6 countries FSC certification led to safer working conditions and enhanced worker skills. It also improved long term planning and strategies for minimising economic damage.

The FSC system provides a robust framework to guarantee compliance with the plethora of legislation, guidelines and best practice that sometimes were not being enforced. It was particularly effective in assisting the forest industry in new EU member states to implement the wide range of EU legislation and guidelines.

Through the need to implement wood-tracing systems FSC has also made a significant contribution to removing ilegally logged timber from supply chains.

FSC certification has also made forests in the surveyed countries a more interesting and safer place to visit through the conservation of sites of historical and cultural significance, complemented by better and safer public access.

"We hope that our study makes the added value of credible forest certification clearer to all and also demonstrates that FSC certification is not just good for the environment, but for business and society as well. It has the ability to deliver on a variety of policy priorities that the European Commission and EU Governments have committed to", said Pollard "The conclusions from this study positions FSC certification as an invaluable investment for the present and the future management of Europe's forests".

"This study confirms FSC as the international standard to promote responsible management of the world's forests", said Heiko Liedeker, FSC Executive Director. "It shows tangible benefits from the FSC system in the social, environmental and economic areas in Europe. We know that the FSC system is delivering the same benefits in other continents and, without doubt, FSC has proved that it is a powerful and comprehensive driven system to promote responsible forest management worldwide".

FSC Russia

After searching for several months and upon recommendation of various stakeholders, FSC International announced in February that Dr. Andrei Ptichnikov has been appointed as Director FSC Russia, based in Moscow.

In addition to representing FSC interests in Russia and liaising with all stakeholder groups interested in Russian forestry, Andrei Ptichnikov will support the FSC Russia National Initiative in its efforts aimed at achieving FSC accreditation and developing national and regional standards, and he will work towards the establishment of an FSC National Office in Russia during 2005.

Forestry Commission Re-certified

The Forestry Commission has been successfully re-audited against the UK Woodland Assurance Standard (UKWAS), confirming the nation's public woods are being managed sustainably. SGS Qualifor undertook the audit of the Forestry Commission and will continue as its certificationbody for the next five years.

The Forestry Commission has 1,043,653 hectares of certified land in the UK, as follows:

- Scotland 657,790 hectares
- England 258,302 hectares
- Wales 127,561 hectares

This means consumers can continue to buy the FC range of British woodland products stamped with the FSC logo, including timber, signs, outdoor furniture and venison.

FC Director General Tim Rollinson said the audit reflected the fact that Britain's woodlands were being managed to internationally recognised standards of sustainability. "The Forestry Commission is the largest provider of public access and recreation in Britain and the largest manager of Sites of Special Scientific Interest," he said. "We're also the largest producer of wood - a top class, sustainable raw material.

"We have a UK Woodland Assurance Standard that is the envy of many countries in the world. Our forests, sustainably managed as this proves, can be infinitely sustainable. The products from them - whether they be wood or recreation and clean air - can boost the quality of our lives.

"What certification reinforces is that people can buy wood knowing it is renewable and sustainable, and that by doing so they are helping safeguard our precious forest and woodland resources for future generations."

Submission of UK Woodland Assurance Standards (UKWAS) Revision 2004 to FSC for assessment

The FSC UK membership signed up to the revised UKWA Standard at the beginning of December 2004 and it was submitted to FSC Accreditation and Business Unit (ABU) on the 17th December 2004. From here the ABU will assess the revised standard and put their recommendations to the FSC Board early in 2005, when the Board will decide whether the revised standard should be accepted as the new standard for FSC Forest Certification in the UK. Once accepted, the revised standard will be available for use in FSC certification for the UK, but until then the current version of UKWAS shall continue to be used.

Following the stakeholder consultation, back in May and June 2004, the UKWAS Steering Group worked hard to resolve the main issues identified for revision, taking account of the comments and suggestions received from the wider consultation.
